Cllr L Freer said that it had been a wonderful night. She commented that the alleyway from the bus station to Long Street was very dark and narrow. It was agreed to put this on a future agenda.

4. REPORTS FROM POLICE, BOROUGH AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

A written report had been received from County Cllr McLauchlan, this was circulated and noted.

County Cllr N Dirveiks reported that he had been dealing with traffic and lighting issues, there were issues with lighting for shift workers changing and travelling. There was a problem still at Friar's Gate where trees were blocking the lighting, although better now the leaves had started falling. The temporary repair of the kerbs, at Carlyon Road was lasting well, and would be extended towards the A5 next year.

Borough Cllr L Dirveiks reported that the waste collections rounds were completely new, the recycling previously being done by contractors. There was a lot more recycling taking place than had been expected. Flats and multi-occupancy were a problem, and terraced houses, where there was limited space for bin storage.

County Cllr N Dirveiks said that there was a problem at the junction of the A5 and Merevale Road, where the height restriction sign could only be seen when approaching from Tamworth, this caused HGVs to have to reverse back from the low bridge, he was contacting the Highways Authority. R Taylor said that Satnavs guided people that way.

Cllr Dirveiks reported that the excessive speed of cars coming from the A5 slip road into Long Street, was an issue and he was investigating the position of the speed restriction change.

Cllr Jarvis said that there were still lights not working around the Memorial Hall.

Cllr L Dirveiks said how good Dicken's Night had been.

Cllr M Davis said that the ice rink had been very well used, he also stated that the major issue locally would be the new development. Cllr L Freer said the ice rink had been very good and should be used again.
